

After the phenomenal academic success of the Indian Cancer Congress 2023, it was time for the Indian Society of Oncology (ISO) to welcome the New Year 2024 with more than 100 new members, the overall strength of the ISO now stands at over 2820 members.

Following this the ISO was involved in the conduct of the hugely successful ISO MVRCON 2024 in Calicut from August 30 the September 1st 2024, under the Chairmanship of Dr. Narayanakutty Warrier. The conference attracted more than 1450 registrations. The ISO was happy to give away more than 10 awards to the Residents who presented the Best Papers, Posters and Critically acclaimed papers.

The ISO in a historic collaboration with 13 other National Societies, spearheaded by the Association of Physicians of India (API) helped develop the "Indian Consensus Guideline on Adult Immunization" The complexities of healthcare in India coupled with the increasing geriatric population, necessitates a proactive approach to adult immunization. The guideline delves into the specifics of each available adult vaccine, offering insights and providing a unified voice amid the existing plethora of guidelines.

The ISO is also actively engaging with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Government of India to promote wellness and good health in an effort to combat the growing challenge of non-communicable diseases especially cancer. By being a full-time member of the UICC, the ISO is dedicated to unite and support the cancer community in an effort to reduce the global cancer burden.

In the near future, the ISO is planning to have interactive multi-disciplinary Virtual Tumor Boards in the 3rd week of Wednesday. These Boards are expected to discuss real world complex cancer cases which would aid the treating oncologists sharpen their clinical acumen. Additionally, the ISO wishes to conduct multiple Cancer Education CMEs in Medical Colleges across the country targeting the young medical graduates to create awareness about the tenets of cancer prevention, diagnosis and personalized management by promoting a multi-disciplinary disciplinary approach to cancer care and cancer control.

The next National Conference of ISMPO-ISO 2025 is expected to be held in Jaipur in the third quarter of 2025, further details would follow.

Cancer Education CME at Dr. M.K. Shah Medical College and Research Centre and Smt. S.M.S. Multispeciality Hospital, Ahmedabad in Association with Indian Society of Oncology* On 14th September 2024.

Dr. M.K. Shah Medical College organized a Continuing Medical Education on cancer education in collaboration with the Indian Society of Oncology (ISO). The event was aimed at enhancing the knowledge base of medical students, faculties and healthcare professionals on the latest developments in oncology, fostering deeper understanding of cancer prevention, diagnosis, and treatment, and promoting an interdisciplinary approach to cancer care. The CME was inaugurated by Dr. M M Prabhakar Mediacal Superintendent, Dr. AT Leuva Dean Dr. Chaitri Shah Additional Superintendent, Dr. G H Rathod Head of the Department General Surgery and Dr. Rajendra Toprani, President ISO, who highlighted the importance of continuous learning in the fast-evolving field of oncology. With cancer incidence on the rise globally and in India, the need for up-to-date knowledge and skills among medical professionals has become more pressing than ever. Leading oncologists, surgeons, and researchers from across the city of Ahmedabad including Dr. Samir Batham an executive committee member of ISO addressed the gathering. The speakers covered a wide range of topics, Dr. Dhruw Patel (Surgical Oncologist) spoke on Recent Advancements in Ovarian Cancers management, Dr. Daxesh Patel (Head and Neck Surgical Oncologist) spoke on Salivary gland tumours, Dr. Rajendra Toprani delivered a lecture on approach to solitary thyroid nodule, Dr. Bharat Prajapati (GI Surgeon) spoke on minimal access surgery in colorectal cancers, Patel(Surgical Oncologist) presented how to deal with malignant breast lump and Dr. Ekta Vala Chandarana (Medical Oncologist) spoke on recent advances in breast cancer treatment and Dr. Samir Batham discussed role of radiation therapy in solid tumors. Other topics included molecular oncology, immunotherapy and precision medicine. Importance of early detection and screening programs were highlighted and emphasised, especially for high-burden cancers in India such as breast, cervical,













and oral cancers. Discussions revolved around the integration of these programs into primary care settings and the role of public health initiatives in reducing cancer morbidity and mortality. The participants were updated on new treatment modalities, including targeted therapies, novel chemotherapeutic agents, and radiation therapy techniques. A special focus was given to personalized cancer treatments, including the role of genetic and molecular profiling in guiding therapy choices. Emphasis was placed on the collaborative nature of cancer treatment, where surgical oncologists, medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, radiologists, pathologists, and palliative care teams work together to ensure comprehensive care for patients. A panel discussion on managing complex cases showcased the benefits of this approach, highlighting case studies where interdisciplinary interventions improved patient outcomes. The CME concluded with a valedictory function, where Dr. Rajendra Toprani, reiterated the need for continuous collaboration between medical institutions and professional societies to combat the growing cancer burden in India. The success of the event was acknowledged by all participants. The event was attended by over 150 delegates and included faculties & residents from General Surgery, ENT, Gynec, Pathology & radiology departments. It served as a platform for knowledge exchange and professional development, and it reinforced the critical role of medical education in improving cancer care and patient outcomes. The collaborative efforts of Dr. M.K. Shah Medical College and the Indian Society of Oncology were appreciated, and plans for future CMEs on specialized

CANCON 2024: A Grand Success

Kozhikode: MVR Cancer Centre and the Indian Society of Oncology (ISO) jointly organized the CANCON (Cancer Conference) 2024, an international seminar held from August 29 to September 1-2024 at MVR Cancer Centre and Research Institute, Calicut. The event served as a platform for discussions on advanced cancer treatments and various modern therapeutic approaches, bringing together international and national experts.

With over **330 speakers,** including 1**0 international delegates** and **700 national delegates**, the seminar was a significant gathering of oncological expertise.

Inauguration and Keynote Addresses

The formal inauguration of CANCON 2024 was conducted by **Padma Shri Dr. Ravi Kannan,** who emphasized the importance of social commitment in the medical field. Dr. Narayanankutty Warrier, Medical Director of MVR Cancer Centre, presided over the event, while Dr. Dileep Damodaran introduced the chief guest. The keynote address was delivered by **Dr. Rajendra Thopran**, President of the ISO.

Theme and Focus Areas

The theme for CANCON 2024 was **"Pushing the boundaries for cure."** This year's discussions mainly focused on how to treat patients with innovative therapeutic approaches, especially those who experience a recurrence of cancer after initial treatments.

Participation from International Experts

Specialists from India, the USA, Europe, the UK, and Singapore presented on various modern cancer therapies. Sessions included insights into Immunotherapy, Targeted Therapy, Robotic Surgery, HIPEC (Hyperthermic Intraperitoneal Chemotherapy), and SBRT (Stereotactic Body Radiation Therapy).

Advanced Treatment Discussions

A major focus was on **CAR-T cell therapy**, which has become more accessible and affordable in India, offering hope for patients with recurring blood cancers. Experts discussed the challenges in matching suitable donors for bone marrow transplants and innovative methods to improve treatment outcomes.

Workshops and Sessions

The conference included workshops on **Physiotherapy, Psycho-oncology,** and **Nutritional Oncology,** highlighting the holistic aspects of cancer care. With participation from over **150 research institutions,** CANCON 2024 attracted more than **1,000 experts,** making it a resounding success.

Summary

CANCON has evolved into a prominent international seminar for discussions on cutting-edge cancer treatments. The fifth edition of this event in 2024 concluded with great enthusiasm and success, leaving a lasting impact on the field of oncology


